 - An effective dispute settlement system is the backbone of the WTO. It is essential to ensuring the credibility, stability, and predictability of the multilateral trading system a system that HKC deeply values and is determined to protect and uphold.
 - While the Appellate Body remains paralyzed, the Multiparty Interim Appeal Arbitration Arrangement (MPIA) has served as a pragmatic and

credible alternative, offering Members who have joined the MPIA access to an impartial and binding appeal mechanism. This initiative exemplifies how WTO Members can come together, even in times of crisis, to safeguard the rule of law in international trade. We welcome Malaysia's announcement today to become the newest participant to the MPIA and encourage other interested Members to join the MPIA before the Appellate Body resumes its operation.
